## **Important Old Testament Dates & Time Periods**

These are taken from Halley's Bible Handbook, page 34. While these dates are not necessarily precise, they do give a good perspective on Old Testament times.

Notice that the time period between Adam and Abram (Gen 1:1 - Gen 12:1) covers about half of the entire 4000 year period covered by Old Testament.

#### **Periods**

Patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac & Jacob	200 years	2000-1800 BC

The Kingdom: Saul, David & Solomon	120 years	1053-933 BC
The Divided Kingdom	200 years	933-721 BC

#### **Dispensations Covered by the Old Testament**

Five of the Seven Dispensations are covered during the period of the Old Testament. A dispensation refers to the way in which God dealt with man during a certain period of time. The dispensations covered by the Old Testament are as follows.

- 1. The Dispensation of Innocence Ended with the Fall of Man
- 2. The Dispensation of Conscience Ended with the Flood
- 3. The Dispensation of Human Government Ended with the Tower of Babel
- 4. The Dispensation of Promise Ended with the Captivity in Egypt
- 5. The Dispensation of the Law Ended with the preaching of John the Baptist and the coming of Christ.

The final two dispensations, which are covered by the New Testament, are

- 6. The Dispensation of Grace (the Church Age), ending with the Rapture, and
- 7. The Millennial Reign of Christ, which ends with the final revolt led by Satan and the Great White Throne of Judgment.
